
Section 4(f) and Chapter 26

Section 4(f) and Chapter 26 are federal and state regulations, respectively, set up to protect the use of public lands in projects. These regulations require TxDOT to inform and gather input from the public.

Protected Properties

TxDOT determined that the project would impact the following resources owned and operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers:


- Lavon Lake Vegetative Management Area
- Caddo Park, including Caddo Park Lavon Lake Historic District

TxDOT is conducting and will provide final 4(f) analysis documentation once the State Historic Preservation Office and other consulting parties have reviewed determinations of eligibility and effect under Section 106. Under Section 106, agencies must consider the effects of their actions on historic properties, defined as resources that are included in, or eligible for inclusion in, the National Register. Through consultation, TxDOT will identify ways to mitigate the project's adverse effects, as well as notify the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation about any potential adverse effects.
