

Notice Virtual Public Hearing with In-Person Option

US 287 From US 67 to BUS 287 CSJs: 0172-05-127; 0172-13-008

Ellis County, Texas

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is proposing improvements to US 287 from US 67 to BUS 287 north of Waxahachie, approximately 8.3 miles, in Ellis County, Texas. This notice advises the public that TxDOT will be conducting an online virtual public hearing on the proposed project with an inperson option.

The virtual hearing will consist of a pre-recorded video presentation and will include both audio and visual components. The public hearing materials will be posted online by Thursday, Aug. 15, 2024 at 5 p.m., and will remain online until Friday, Aug. 30, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. If you do not have internet access, you may call 214-320-4431 between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, to ask questions and access project materials during the project development process.

Additionally, TxDOT is providing an in-person option for individuals who would like to participate in person instead of online. The in-person option will be held in an open house format with a live presentation at 6 p.m. In-person attendees will be able to review hard copies of project materials, ask questions of TxDOT staff and/or consultants, and leave written comments. The in-person option will be held on Thursday, Aug. 15, 2024 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at Midlothian Conference Center - Bluebonnet II Room, 1 Community Circle Dr., Midlothian, TX 76065.

Proposed improvements include constructing new two-lane northbound and southbound US 287 frontage roads with ten-foot shared-use paths for bicyclists and pedestrians on both sides, new access ramps and new grade separated interchanges.

The proposed project would, subject to final design considerations, require approximately 44.6 acres of additional right of way and potentially displace two non-residential structures. Relocation assistance is available for displaced persons and businesses. Information about the TxDOT Relocation Assistance Program and services and benefits for those displaced and other affected property owners, as well as information about the tentative schedule for right-of-way acquisition and construction, can be obtained from the TxDOT district office by calling 214-320-6675 or visiting the project website.

The proposed project would involve construction in wetlands. The proposed project would involve an action in a floodplain.

Any environmental documentation or studies, any maps and drawings showing the project location and design, tentative construction schedules, and other information regarding the proposed project are on file and available for inspection Monday through Friday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. at TxDOT Dallas District Office, 4777 East US Hwy 80, Dallas, TX 75150. These materials will also be available in hard copy form for review at the in-person option.

The virtual public hearing and in-person option will be conducted in English. If you need an interpreter or document translator because English is not your primary language or you have difficulty communicating effectively in English, one will be provided to you. If you have a disability and need assistance, special arrangements can be made to accommodate most needs. Please be aware that advance notice is required as some services and accommodations may require time for TxDOT.
